

Tardebigge Produce Show Schedule 2024

Please be aware that all exhibits will be auctioned at the end of the show (unless section notes indicate otherwise). You may remove your items from the church hall between 2.15 and 3.00 p.m. if you do not wish them to be auctioned.

Precise requirements for entries in each class can be found in the “Notes for Exhibitors’ document. For all trophies (except for Section 3), merit awards will contribute to overall scores as follows: 1st = 3 points, 2nd = 2 points, 3rd = 1 point. Trophies will be held for twelve months.

SECTION 1 – VEGETABLES, FRUIT AND FLOWERS

All exhibits in this section **must have been grown by the exhibitor**. Exhibitors should provide proper display items and remove all receptacles not required for showing (see “Notes for Exhibitors” if you are not sure what this involves). Disposable plates will be made available for display of exhibits.

The **St Bartholomew Cup** will be awarded to the exhibitor with the greatest points total from all of the classes in this section. Separate cups will also be awarded for the Vegetables and Fruit section (the **Swann Vegetable Cup**) and in the Flowers section (the **Swann Flower Cup**).

SECTION 2 - FLOWER ARRANGEMENTS

The **Dick & Mary Goulbourne Cup** will be awarded to the exhibitor with the greatest number of points in this section.

The flowers used need **not** have been grown by the exhibitor, **except for Class 38**. Accessories are permitted. **Entries in section 2 remain the property of the exhibitor and will not be sold at the auction.**

SECTION 3 - HOME-MADE DRINKS

The **Jim Hutchings Cup** will be awarded to the exhibitor of the finest drink in the show. **Clear** glass bottles must be used, preferably fitted with a flanged cork, and bearing a plain label indicating the type of drink, contents and year.

- 40** Bottle of home-made alcoholic drink (wine, gin, beer, cider etc.)
- 41** Bottle of home-made non-alcoholic drink (lemonade, cordial, ginger beer etc.)

SECTION 4 – JAMS, JELLIES AND PRESERVES

The **Reginald Underhill Cup** will be awarded to the exhibitor with the greatest number of points in this section.

Preserves should be presented in a plain jar, with either a twist top or waxed disc and cellophane cover. Ideally, trade jars or lids should not be used. A label should be attached to all jars, naming the contents **and stating full date when made**.

SECTION 6 - PHOTOGRAPHY

Entries in section 6 remain the property of the exhibitor and will not be sold at the auction.

SECTION 7 – CRAFTS

Entries in section 7 remain the property of the exhibitor and will not be sold at the auction.

- 61 A greetings card in any medium.

JUNIOR SECTION

All ages in this section to be taken as on the date of the Show. All entries **MUST** be exhibitors' own work. Entries should be clearly labelled with the exhibitor's **age**.

Entries in the junior section remain the property of the exhibitor and will not be sold at the auction.

- 62 A painting of any subject (max. size A3 (30 x 42 cm)).
- 63 A collage of any subject (max. size A3 (30 x 42cm))..
- 64 A model made from recyclable junk (max. size 30 x 30 x 30cm).
